

OUR STORY

Boys & Girls Clubs of Muncie has been a cornerstone of the community since opening its doors in 1933. Founded by Branch McClung and a group of sorority women, the first meeting was in a 3rd floor room of the Anthony Building on the corner of Jackson and Walnut. In 1951 the Madison Street location was built and opened under the name of Muncie Boys Club. While girls could attend the Boys Club, the name was officially changed to The Muncie Boys & Girls Club in 1989. In 2018, the Muncie Boys & Girls Club merged with the Roy C. Buley Community Center to strengthen its ability to reach those who need us most thereby becoming the Boys & Girls Clubs of Muncie.

Today, when schools are out, we are here for our kids, providing a safe space to learn, grow, and plan for their futures. Dedicated staff who inspire our kids every day through high yield, time tested programs, are the key to helping provide Great Futures for our Kids.

SMART MOVES | A supplement to the SMART Girls and Passport to Manhood programs helping teens learn to achieve mutually supportive relationships free of violence and abuse.

PASSPORT TO MANHOOD

Consists of 14 sessions that focus on various aspects of manhood through a personal journey of maturation and growth.

FINANCIAL LITERACY | Members develop financial literacy skills to prepare them to responsibly budget, spend, save, and invest money as well as make career and financial decisions that will positively impact their livelihood.

HEALTHY HABITS | Focuses on making choices that support a healthy eating pattern and physical wellness. This program is made up of interactive activities that develop a young person's ability, confidence and motivation to eat healthy for life.

JUNIOR PRODUCERS | Members will receive instruction on engineering audio production, songwriting, musical instrumentation, and explore all phases of musical creation.


INTRO TO THE THEATER | Introduces and explores theater from page to stage as a live performing art. Topics include the relationship between theater, theater tech, dramatic structure, theatrical representation, and the crafts of theater artists such as directors, designers, playwrights, and actors.

STEM | Through science, technology, engineering, and math, members test theories in fun ways to expand their minds and find different avenues in which they can use the information obtained in the activities for everyday situations.

INTRO TO FINE ARTS | Members will explore all aspects of the fine arts. Members will also integrate with other programs such as performing arts to participate in their artistic needs.

KEYSTONE CLUB | A dynamic teen program that affords teens the opportunity to gain valuable leadership and experience.

INNOVATION TECHNOLOGY | Members explore several avenues of technology such as coding and robotics. Structurally, this program prepares members for success in the technology field for career development and for just hobbies.



HOW WE SERVE THE COMMUNITY

For more than 88 years, Boys & Girls Clubs of Muncie, with a sense of purpose and agency, has navigated times of tragedy and crisis to provide a safe place for kids and teens.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Muncie implemented protocols to support staff, youth and their families during COVID-19. Club staff were able to immediately start checking on families, created on-line activities for youth to participate with and even provided Easter dinner for families.

The Clubs provided school day support to those kids and teens by providing an e-learning facility for those families of essential workers as well as those who were enrolled in the virtual learning program through Muncie Community Schools.

The Clubs have been available to families during early dismissal days, school breaks, summer, before school care and the after school program.




